Third Tu BiShvat since the war

- Nearly 2,000 Israelis killed
- More than 30,000 injured
- 80 communities displaced
- 1 Israeli still in captivity
- 7 fronts war, tenuous ceasefires *both* in the North & South

Nature is suffering from war

- Blackened forests, barren land, desolation
- 23,000 hectares of open land burned, including 2,900 hectares of KKL-JNF forests
- **Amnun forest:** nearly two-thirds of new planted areas burned in the war due to rocket fire. Significant damage to irrigation system as well.
- **Re'im forest:** Fires caused by previous arson balloon attacks, drought and soil erosion, and war related activity.

Forests are lifelines for communities

- Forests near Re'im and Amnun provide shade, recreation, and emotional solace.
- Essential for the environment, economy, and resilience of the people who live nearby.

Focus on "Replanting"

- Planting, rebuilding, and restoring
- Amnun Forest (North)
- Re'im Forest (South)

These forests are more than trees

- **North:** Pilgrim's Trail, wildlife, recreational spaces, shore of the Galilee
- **South:** includes sites of Nova Festival, Be'eri Cycling Trail, Hiking, Darom Adom Festival, annual Kibbutz Be'eri Tu BiShvat tree planting ceremony

KKL-JNF's priorities

- **North:** Preservation and restoration of natural forests. Maintaining archaeological activities, trail development, and service roads.
- **South:** Restoration planting up to the fence line. Community rehabilitation that leads to active, safe, and thriving tourism. (Delegations can visit the planting sites during planting and participate in planting activities.)
